MEMBERS of VIC paid their respects to the fallen at services all over East Lancashire. **Greater Manchester and** in London.

The Sandbag Café in Preston, a joint enterprise between VIC and Lancashire Armed Forces Association, featured on Granada Reports and D-Day East Lancashire Regiment veteran Richard Brock was interviewed by the BBC.

Wreaths were laid in Accrington, Haslingden and Rawtenstall by VIC members Phil Speddy and Bob Brindley.

Veteran Duncan Phillips and Von laid the wreath in Clitheroe, while Ron Flowers and Geof were at St Lawrence Church where their Regiment Chapel is.

In Bacup, press officer Catherine Smyth, RAF veteran Bernard Tighe and others were in attendance, while on Armistice Day Phil, Bob and Catherine joined pupils from Northern

Primary School at what is reputed to be the highest war memorial in England on Deerplay Moor above

Administrator Amy Thompson, who is also the Lancashire Royal British Legion standard bearer, was again invited to take part in the Festival of Remembrance event at the Royal Albert Hall in London.

While, Outreach Worker Steve Butterworth attended the Bury and Ramsbottom Remembrance Services.

As well as organising the 135 crosses to the First World War soldiers at Bacup Cemetery, veteran Bill Ogden, Bernard and Catherine also held a short ceremony and laid a wreath.

The VIC Choir visited Jubilee Court Haslingden to share in their Remembrance Celebrations singing a selection of 20 songs and they received personal donations from the residents totalling £40.

Ring of Red

THOUSANDS of bikers gathered in horrendous weather to mark Remembrance Sunday by encircling the M60 motorway and raising money for VIC.

As the chosen charity for this year's Ring of Red M60 (Manchester), VIC was honoured to be able to run a stall at Birch Services as the bikers gathered.

This year, several members of VIC



were able to complete the ride on their own bikes.

Operations Manager Bob Elliott,

Volunteer Arts and Crafts Co-ordinator Darren Horsnell and Graham Limb, Willie and Sam in the van

and others attended along with friends from the Throttle Twisters Motor Cycle Club.

Bob said: "The Throttle Twisters had also been at Royton Remembers. Willie and Sam brought the van and did the route following the bikes.

"From the stall. which sold items made at VIC as well as donations, we raised £500. We will also receive a contribution from the organisers early in the New Year."

There were 2,500 bikes in attendance and most of the bikers were wearing



Walk of Remembrance
















He paid his respects at 61 different memorials in Rossendale, slept outdoors for five nights and raised more than £1,500 for VIC.

Every day, the Royal Pioneer Corps veteran was joined on his walk by Royal Signals veteran Bob Brindley and when Phil was finding the going tough, Bob ensured he kept going.

They both went on a Battlefields Tour with VIC in September and sat together in the minibus, so had already forged a friendship.

The memorial tour started at 7am in Weir on November 5 when the remote hilltop memorial was shrouded in mist, barely visible from the roadside and eerily silent.

Bob said: "The weather that day added to the atmosphere of what we were doing and it made us focus on what we were embarking on."

That first day was the hardest as, along with Royal Signals Veteran Bill Ogden, the trio completed 14 miles walking from Weir to Whitworth with Phil carrying a full pack complete with rations, tent and sleeping bag.

Reflecting on the week, Phil said: "After a couple of days and nights out, I was really feeling it and walking down towards Rawtenstall; the weather was not brilliant.

"Those were the times that Bob stepped in and would be encouraging saying the next memorial was only just up the





hill."

They were constantly being stopped by people donating money to the charity. On day one a high school student gave them 50p, and apologised that it was all he had.

In Stubbins, Phil and Bob were stunned when a business owner handed over £230 in cash – and when they called in at the company Melba Swintex they received a further £40 from reception.

Bob said: "I will never forget the generosity, the warmth and the sense of community."

They were joined by another VIC Veteran Michael Leather, AKA Mini.

He had just completed a marathon for the charity and ran from home to join them, only for Phil to realise they lived on the same road.

At the memorial in Stubbins, a guy who was doing cable work came across to make a contribution and said how his cousin had been killed in Afghanistan and he had been given a wonderful send off by the army, Mini had been in the same regiment and knew him.

On Friday Veteran Willie Wilcox joined the walk and also









slept over which Phil said lightened the evening having some company.

On Remembrance Sunday Phil and Bob walked to services in Accrington, Haslingden and Rawtenstall where they also met with Squirrels and Beavers from 38th Rossendale Open Scout Group who had made the crosses that had been placed by Phil.

He said: "Thanks to the Rossendale Family History Society for mapping out the memorials, which provided the starting point for the walk."

VIC provided daily support and many veterans joined him along the journey.
